Statement for those affected by Hurricane Ian

September 30th, 2022

Cuplet Fern Members-

Powerful storms like Hurricane Ian create widespread wind and water devastation. Many emergency management organizations such as the Red Cross, FEMA, and local authorities are working hard to make sure people get the help they need as quickly as possible.

Disaster relief workers are on the ground and hundreds more are on the way from different states. Before impacts were felt, emergency response vehicles were pre-positioned. Restoration of power and roadways remain within their scope of top priorities. As conditions slowly improve, response efforts will expand as evacuation centers transition to emergency shelters with more robust services.

Be safe and listen to the advice of emergency officials. If you need help, reach out to trained professionals by calling 911. If you need a safe place to stay, find open shelters on redcross.org or by calling 1-800-RED CROSS (800-733-2767).

You can also find shelters at floridadisaster.org or by following your local county and city officials on social media or monitoring local news for information. Dial 311 if you need transportation to an emergency shelter.
